




What is Compline?

Building Steward Information

Hello,

After nine years, I am “retiring” as the Building Steward of Main Street UMC on December 31, 2018.. While serving as the Building Steward, I have been blessed by interactions with individuals, such as yourselves, in meaningful ways, and I have been introduced to a realm of people, activities, and information of which I otherwise would not have had the opportunity. Serving has encouraged me to develop gifts and skills which have improved my ability to adapt in other settings. Serving as Building Steward has provided unique opportunities for fellowship and serving others. These interactions, experiences, and challenges have helped me to grow as an individual, deepened my faith, and nurtured my love for my brothers and sisters in Christ. I encourage you to volunteer in some capacity at Main Street if you are not already doing so.

I am stepping down with joy and the comfort of knowing that Judy von Bernuth has volunteered to serve as the next Building Steward for MSUMC beginning on January 1, 2019. Judy is active in our church and with community groups, which perfectly suits this role which connects us to our community. Judy will be working closely with Pastor Linda, MSUMC staff, the Trustee Committee, and specifically with Helen Ammons, in the role. Thank you, Judy, for accepting the opportunity to serve as our Building Steward, a liaison for our church with our community. For those who are not familiar with the role of Building Steward, I share the following:

The Building Steward Role and procedures were established to provide a representative to act on behalf of the Trustees, and church, in cooperation with the pastor, to ensure that the needs and expectations of both the church and guest groups are met. The Building Steward is a liaison to coordinate events and to provide a "go to" person for “guest/outside” groups, and to ensure that while providing a resource for the community, we stay focused on our mission as a church. The role was established out of necessity in 2009, and as a whole, has been conducive to establishing good relations with groups in and out of our community.

An outside group is defined as any non-profit group that is not directly under Main Street's Ministries (Children, Youth, UMW, Preschool); so, even if we are hosting a group, we still need for them to complete a form and sign the Use Agreement. Even if a member is involved in the group, a form must be completed, fees paid, and preferably signed by the director(s) or leader of the group rather than the member (unless they are a Director as in the case of Don Coffey and the Waynesboro Choral Society).



Recycling: We need a couple of more folks, for next year, to do recycling. If you might be able to help, please consider joining the recycling team. It involves being in charge of recycling in the kitchen, as well as paper recycling from the office copy room and choir room, for one month. It usually involves 1-4 trips to the recycle center, depending on the volume that month and your individual pace. If you think you might be interested, please contact Evelyn Cotton, the kitchen steward.

MAIN STREET FOOD PANTRY REPORT

The pantry has a long history, beginning in the early 80's, through the effort of several church members including Lou Trott, who passed on Dec. 14th. Lou's efforts began the pantry over 35 years ago and his many hours of service are greatly appreciated.

As the 2018 year rapidly comes to a close, the Main Street Food Pantry continues to provide assistance to Waynesboro, Staunton and Augusta county households. Each household may receive food from our pantry once each month.

The bulk of the food comes from bi-monthly deliveries from the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank in Verona. Additional food donations are received each week from our two local Food Lion stores.



The pantry's work is only possible due to the 25 workers that volunteer their time and to the monthly donations that you make to the ministry. The operating budget of the pantry is totally separate from the annual Main Street budget.

Each day usually 4 to 6 workers: register clients, fill boxes with about 30 Lbs. of food and maintain our records. Month end reports of food inventories and clients are sent to the BRAFB as required by USDA.

The use of computers, for client visit registration, has greatly reduced the paper work effort and monthly reporting to the food bank. We can always use new helpers whether working a regular schedule or as backup due to staff sickness or vacation.

We're open from 9:30 – 11 each morning, Monday through Thursday. You are welcome to come down the steps or through the alley door to visit any time.

On behalf of the food pantry ministry, I want to thank you for your support.
