

It is simply hoped that what is presented will be a tickler for each of our thinking caps....to live safer each day.

I bet we are doing a good job with changing batteries in our smoke detectors & carbon monoxide alarms annually, remembering each device has a "life" of service and may test OK and not be OK. But what about *disposal* of those (typically) 9 volt batteries? Did you know that most often there is enough juice in them to start a fire in, say, a trash can, if the terminals are bridged with metal or other conductive stuff? Yep, it is true!

The fix? Don't just toss them in the trash. The easiest and direct way to prevent the bridging is to tape the two terminals with a non-conductive tape (electrician's tape, or even regular ole Scotch tape will work). You get the idea...keep them from "shorting" and making something hot.

Oh, did you know that the Waynesboro Fire Department has a free smoke detector program if you need a unit and are short on cash? They will even install it for you! 

Church Door Lock Upgrade

A project to upgrade church exterior access security was identified, studied, quotes obtained and project approved by both the Trustees and Church Council in 2019. Council asked we delay formally announcing the project until "early next year". We are doing that now for your info... The project is being led by Jim McKinney, Rod Campbell and Richard Ammons, sources for detailed information. The project is to be funded via a Designated/Restricted account, Safety & Security Provisions, #38181, not from the operating budget, exactly like the cameras upgrade of the spring of 2019. When adequate funds are raised, the project will go forward; if funds are inadequate, the project will not be fully executed.

Details will follow separately, but bottom line: select (most entry) exterior doors will be fitted with a door system like that of the main office door, system controlled to schedules for auto unlock and relock per schedules. Scheduled unlocking will not activate until an accredited fob is swiped so church members will be present as doors unlock. Modifications to schedules are readily/easily done by administrators.

When project is completed, present exterior door keys will not be needed (nor will work) to gain church access; that will be done by a fob, exactly as with the present "TruPortal" system at the main office door. We believe this project will significantly improve people and building security, especially during non-worship/ Sunday school/large event times. We ask your consideration to help via gifts to fund #38181,
